It is with a heavy heart that I am sad to report, one of our Board Members, Mark McMullen, who was serving as Board Vice President, past away suddenly on Easter Sunday April 1st. The community boat slips and private dock slips are starting to be moved and relocated and very soon some will need to be nested for the remainder of this year. Unfortunately, this is going to be a short boating season due to lack of rain and the large amount of water being released this year.

Our General Manager Steve Gasperson's last day was June 18th. He will be moving to Idaho the second week of July. Steve has done an excellent job and will be missed. We wish Steve and Tammy a great future. The board met with Stephanie Dayton and all feel that she has the knowledge and experience to take over as General Manager. She has been working in the office for the past 14 years, the last 6 years as assistant manager.

The elections for Board of Director will be held on the 3rd Saturday in September. There are 3 seats open this year. Please consider getting involved, coming to the meetings, being on committees and also by running for the Board to serve your community. Community Plan Ad Hoc Committee Seeks Community Feedback **By Rod Olguin**

As reported in the last Oak Leaves Edition, the Community Plan Ad Hoc Committee has been working on developing a Community Improvement Plan for the West Ramp, Maintenance Yard, Campground and other common areas. The Ad Hoc Committee has been brainstorming ideas on how to best utilize these resources, discussing the merits of each and narrowing their focus on the ideas that warrant further research. The Ad Hoc Committee intends that any recommended improvements have broad community support and interest before presenting the Plan to the Board.

Your input is valuable and necessary before work on the Plan can proceed further. A survey has been prepared that asks a series of questions soliciting your opinion. The survey can be accessed on the Association's website at <http://oakshores.us/home/bulletin-board/>. Please take a few minutes of your time to respond, It is important that we hear from you. The Ad Hoc Committee will also be working to provide display information at an upcoming community event about our work to date, so keep an eye out for further information.

Introduction to the Community Survey on Our Website Listed Above

The recent purchase of the West Ramp and Maintenance Yard provides an opportunity to plan for their future use and improvement. Formed in March, the Ad Hoc Committee, consisting of community members and staff, has been meeting to formulate a Community Improvement Plan. The Committee is looking at the Campground, Entrance Gate and other common areas as well for ideas on how to best utilize these resources. Intended as a way to initiate a discussion on how the community would like to shape the future of its amenities, the Plan can serve as a blueprint for future improvements. Any recommended improvements approved by the Board could serve as future fundraising and/or budget priorities for the community.

Still early in its work, the Committee has been brainstorming ideas, discussing the merits of each and narrowing their focus on the ideas that warrant further vetting. With staff and volunteer help, some of the ideas already have or can be acted upon immediately. These so called "low hanging fruit" ideas include: reusing the boat slips replaced from the private marina and relocating them to the west ramp; cleaning up the dead trees and other debris and grading out the ruts at the west ramp; cleaning up the playground and improving the volleyball court and horse shoe pit at the campground; and providing trash cans and dog poop stations at each mail box location.

Other ideas are longer term in nature due to cost, complexity or other issues. It is these that the Ad Hoc Committee would like your feedback before proceeding further to ensure they have broad community support and interest. 7. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.
8. No glass containers. Use caution when bringing food into the area.





FIRE WISE Committee Update

Special thanks to all of our supporters who helped prepare, cook and serve at our Memorial Day BBQ on May 28. Our DJ, Mario, played excellent music for the evening. Our weather even cooperated. Fire Wise made a profit of \$1,400 which included \$450 in donations.

Fire Wise now has approximately \$5,000 which will be earmarked for fire safe projects at Oak Shores as requested by OSCA. Project examples are (1) the purchase of commercial grade chain saws for weed removal on green belts; (2) Chipping days and dead tree removal not covered by grants. These funds save OSCA funds.

On June 13, Fire Wise sponsored an evening at Oak Shores on Emergency/Evacuation Kits to be prepared at home. Forty residents attended the advertised meeting at our Clubhouse. Bruce Fosdike and Roberta from Cambria were the presenters. Bruce is a retired Battalion Chief who has trained fire personnel and now volunteers to present this training information in local communities. A few examples of Home Safety features were safety zones outside houses (storage, landscaping, clearing from 20-100 ft. away from house; nothing flammable under decks, enclosing decks and boxing eaves). Bruce discussed Emergency Kits and containers for storing emergency supplies, which were displayed; he answered questions from the attendees and distributed a number of brochures and checklists for emergency preparation and evacuation. These flyers will be posted in the Fire Wise bulletin board at the Clubhouse, including a fire safe home checklist and a Living With Fires brochure located inside the office.

Bruce's assistant, Roberta, discussed Disaster Preparedness for pets, along with written information also posted on Bulletin Board.

Thank you to all who attended. Fire Wise continues to seek new members. If interested, please call me for information about our next meeting date and time.

EVACUATION CHECKLIST

10 MINUTE LIST

- Grab GO BAG, Water containers, First aid kit.
- Historic files, Computer(s) and power cables.
- Photo albums, Jewelry, Cash, Phone chargers (110 and 12 volt).
- Clothes – with jackets, hats (1 bag each for 5 days) toiletries (essentials only), RX Medications, 1 towel each.
- Sleeping bags, Pillows, Blankets, Spare batteries, Canned food (1 bag).
- Pet carriers/bed, food/water dish and food for 5 days.

20 MINUTE LIST

- Keepsakes, heirlooms (only spend 1 minute)
- Current files, Checkbook, Address book.
- Food (2 more bags, cereal, lunch items, breads). Spare can opener
- Clothes (1 suitcase each for 10 days), Spare shoes, Shower shoes, Spare towels, Toiletries (spare glasses, hair care, non-Rx medications, spare soap and shampoo).
- Pet food for 10 days.
- Large trash bags, plastic sheets.

30 MINUTE PLUS

- Survival items for longer term.
- Tool box, Locks, Tarps, generator.
- Food storage and water purification system.
- Keepsake boxes, Games, Books, Firearms.

SET-UP HOUSE

- Leave a door unlocked.
- Close windows and pull shades.
- Leave lights on.
- Turn off gas.
- Release garage doors.



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


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
